INTRODUCTION. In the past year, we have all been affected by changes in the provision of services. Last April, the changeover from the old system of waste collection caused many headaches but we are assured that most of the problems have now been ironed out or alternative arrangements made.

In Sedlescombe, the loss of the hourly bus service to and from Hastings has further restricted the movement of residents who do not have their own transport. We have lost the Sunday postal collection and are having to get used to later deliveries of mail to our doors. Residents of Roselands sheltered housing will be aware of alterations affecting them with the moving to a team of support workers and other changes.

On the positive side, our Post Office has, for now, been saved. We are very pleased about this as it and its accompanying shop provides so much more than just supply of goods and services. Jenny and John Mainwood always make sure that a wide selection of goods is available and services such as dry cleaning and photocopying are on hand, but the Village Shop is also where we can be almost certain to meet some of our neighbours for a chat or exchange of information. The shop is also the place to buy tickets for village events as well as pick up the Parish News. The Parish News has been under threat again but, thanks to the public spirited action of a few, it has been able to continue with the work being shared about a bit. We are one of the few local Villages to have a weekly news-sheet so please give it your support and buy a copy if you don't do so already.

The Queen's Head changed hands during the year and we welcome the new landlord Grant and his family. Grant swiftly showed that he wanted to be part of the local community and has already become the Chairman of the Sedlescombe Sports Association. The Parish Council is very appreciative of the voluntary work that has been done by local residents to bring the second-hand portacabin at the Sportsfield up to scratch and ready for use by the local sports teams.

Following the local council elections last May, we welcome Caitlin Wheatley who has become a parish councillor. We also welcome a new District Councillor, Tony Ganly, and look forward to working with him as well as continuing to work with our County Councillor Peter Jones. Please come to the Assembly on 29 April to hear both of them speak and to ask them and me any questions you may have.

1. CHAIRMAN'S OPENING REMARKS

- **Councils.** The Chairman opened the meeting by welcoming the public and County Councillor Jones and District Councillor Wilson. Cllr Wilson is not standing for election this year. The two District Councillor candidates, Tony Ganly and Stephen Hardy, were present and were introduced to the meeting. The Chairman acknowledged the valuable work of two parish councillors, Jenny Mitchell and Nick Foord, who would be leaving the Council in May and welcomed their replacements, Caitlin Wheatley and Robert Dudman.
- **Deaths.** She spoke of the death of many Village stalwarts during the past year whose contribution to our community life will be sadly missed.
- **Various subjects** mentioned were: The Welcome Pack (public asked to let the Council know if new people move into the Village so a Pack can be delivered); encouragement to use the businesses advertising in The Directory; the forthcoming combined Pestalozzi/Sedlescombe debate on climate change in the Hall on Saturday 5 May at 7.30pm; the need for additional volunteers to help mow the churchyard (1 to 1.5 hours twice a month) – contact John Roberts of New England Lane.
- **Thanks** were extended to – volunteers who deliver the quarterly Bulletin and Annual Report; the Library Ladies who ensure that there is a good supply of interesting books to borrow; the litter-pickers who keep Sedlescombe looking tidy; Sedlescombe Players who give us a good laugh, youngsters are joining and taking part in productions; John & Jenny Mainwood from the shop who have won the Best South East Region Village Store and Post Office Award; Hard-working parish councillors who have been involved in practical work and arranging the

new Lift Scheme and SID Campaigns; and the tea ladies, Sylvia, Margaret and Rosemary.

- **Pavilion.** The Chairman told the meeting that the Sports Association had recently asked the Parish Council to take over construction of a new pavilion at the Sportsfield funded by way of a loan to be repaid through the Precept. The Sports Association had been trying to obtain funding for ten years without success to date and a Parish Council loan appeared to be the only way of raising the funds to replace the pavilion urgently. Although the subject had not yet been officially discussed at a meeting of the Parish Council, those present were invited to express their support in raising a loan which would mean an increase of about £15 (subject to alteration) for the Band D Sedlescombe Council Tax for many years. John Noonan of the Football Club explained that it was essential to replace the pavilion to accord with new Football Association guidelines. Sports Association fund-raising would continue and donations would be gratefully accepted. After further discussions on the cost, funding and possible incorporation of youth club facilities, there was a show of hands in favour of the Parish Council investigating the idea further.
- **New Police Inspector.** Police Inspector Heather Keating, who had been in post two weeks, introduced herself to the meeting saying that she was very pleased to have moved to rural Rother, a post she had applied for. She would be meeting with parish councillors to progress her priorities of Neighbourhood Policing.

2. MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PARISH MEETING OF SEDLESCOMBE HELD ON 25 APRIL 2006.

The Minutes were included in the Parish Council's Annual Report, a copy of which had been delivered to each Sedlescombe household. It was moved by Sally Martin, seconded by Sally Brown and RESOLVED: That the Minutes of the 2006 Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting are approved. A financial statement was included on the reverse of agendas on seats in the Hall.

3. COUNTY COUNCILLOR PETER JONES.

Cllr Jones thanked the Parish Council Chairman, Councillors and the Clerk for their work not only over the past year but also during the four-year term which is about to come to an end. He mentioned the Report placed on chairs in the Hall which listed some of the

Parish Council's achievements. He commented that Sedlescombe was one of the best councils in the whole of Sussex. His subjects were:

- The Police (he is Chairman of the Sussex Police Authority) where considerable achievements can be seen with crimes falling across nearly all categories and detection rates rising. He is pleased that the call centre is much improved.
- Government underfunding. Although this is causing problems, good and improving services are being provided. There are currently no bed blockers in the hospitals. There has been a big improvement in our schools resulting in a favourable OFSTED report.
- Roads. New Government guidelines were published last autumn and the County Council has recently made £2.5-£3 million available over the next couple of years to provide engineering traffic calming in parishes. The County will work with the parishes to achieve what local people want. Cllr Jones had to admit that, unfortunately, they do not always get it right as the new traffic calming work in the North Trade Road shows.

4. DISTRICT COUNCILLOR MATTHEW WILSON. After eight years serving on the Rother District Council, Cllr Wilson is standing down in May although he will still be working with Rother on the implementation of the new Waste Contract. He added his thanks to the Parish Council for their hard work for the community and said it had been a privilege to represent the people of Sedlescombe.

- Waste and Recycling. Cllr Wilson reported that, very recently, 4,000 wheelie bins and 10,000 boxes were destroyed in a fire in Bexhill setting back the new waste/recycling programme. However, he was pleased that Verdant had won the contract at a price below budget.
- Council Tax. Rother still has the lowest Council Tax in East Sussex and has become a very efficient Council.
- Presentation. Cllr Mrs Wright presented the rose "Nostalgia" to Cllr Wilson in appreciation of his work for the community.

5. SEDLESCOMBE PARISH COUNCIL REPORT. The Parish Council Report was included in the booklet delivered to houses. The Chairman spoke about the displays around the Hall by – Sedlescombe WI – on slavery and other resolutions, designed by Josie Cornish from her hospital bed; Chapel Hill Church – Fair Trade; Neighbourhood Watch; Sedlescombe Societies Association who are planning the forthcoming Fete; the School; Garden Society with tomatoes for sale;

Sedlescombe Green WI; Flower Club; Short Mat Bowls (a new and very successful Club which has extended from one afternoon a week to two); Sedlescombe Branch of the British Legion who have been award the Jelico Shield for the highest percentage increase in membership in the UK; Sedlescombe Stores with a table of new products just arrived.

6. ANY OTHER BUSINESS. The following subjects were discussed:

- **Request for Double White Lines at the top of Church Hill.** Parish Council requested; still with County Council and Police.
- **New stiles and gates on public footpaths.** Footpath Working Group congratulated.
- **Planning Application for extension of hours of use of the multi games area at the School.** Many objections from people living in Streetlands, Gammons Way and The Green who feared too much disturbance at any time from youngsters playing in the area and increased parking in Streetlands. The Headteacher, Marian Ham, explained that the funders, SportEngland, wanted the area to be used by the community and she would like Sedlescombe Rangers to be allowed to use it on Saturday mornings for three hours, for it to be used for occasional PTA events and for youths to be able to play football at times when a member of staff is on duty at the School. There should be no additional parking in Streetlands as the playground will be available as well as the public car park. The School is already planning to plant trees to screen the area from the gardens of houses in The Green. The Parish Council had supported the application but had asked that it be temporary for one year to check whether neighbours are being unreasonably disturbed by the extended use. At the request of a person living in Streetlands, a show of hands was requested resulting in a majority in favour of the extended hours of use.
- **Grass verge cutting.** Residents of Park Shaw were dissatisfied. Cllr Jones to investigate.
- **Wheelie Bins.** Fear that unsightly wheelie bins will be left in front of properties and on pavements throughout the Village. Concern that the elderly will not be able to manage the bins on steep driveways.
- **Buses.** Request that the once an hour bus is returned so that the elderly can go to Eastbourne and Tunbridge Wells. Cllr Jones explained that running buses is expensive; they are not well used and increased

services would mean a considerable increase in Council Tax. He said, however, that he is hoping to introduce some new and innovative measures to help people with transport, for example funding community buses or local taxis. Derek Marshall, Direct at Pestalozzi International Village, spoke of an idea he has to establish a social enterprise for the benefit of the community involving use of the Village's minibuses (which will have to increase in number with more students expected) during the day by the community.

- **Climate Change Debate.** This is the first time that Sedlescombe and Pestalozzi have combined to put on a debate in the Village hall and it is hoped that there will be a good attendance. The MP plans to attend.
- **Parish News.** Valerie Tegg spoke of the difficult situation with the weekly Parish News following Sylvia Cook's illness. Anyone can submit an item for publication free in the news-sheet as long as it is in the shop by midday on Wednesday and the News, which is printed by Mr and Mrs Mainwood, is on sale in the shop on Fridays priced 20p. More copy is needed if it is to continue and, preferably, someone else to edit it as the Teggs, who have taken on the editorship again, were editors for many years prior to Sylvia taking over. Valerie thanked Margaret and Roy Smith for their occasional help.
- **School Governor.** Whilst on her feet, Valerie Tegg spoke of her support for Marian Ham at the School whom she described as an "exceptional Headteacher" with a very caring attitude towards the community who would not allow anything to take place in the School or its grounds to upset those living nearby. This was endorsed by the meeting.
- **Thanks.** The Chairman closed the meeting by thanking the Clerk, her Vice-Chairman and other councillors. Cllr Rand, in turn, thanked the Chairman for her tremendous enthusiasm in leading the Parish Council.

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS SUMMARY

The Parish Council's accounts are prepared in accordance with the Accounts & Audit Regulations 2003, as amended in 2006. Each year, they are subject to audit. Mrs Valerie Bennett of Whatlington has been appointed by the Council to do the Internal Audit of the 2007-8 Accounts and External Audit will be carried out by Mazars. Every year, local government electors are given an opportunity to examine the Council's accounts and financial records. The 2007-8 accounts and records are expected to be available for inspection from mid-July 2008 by appointment with the Clerk/Responsible Financial Officer (01424 870508).

2007-8 Financial Year. As expected, most of the Council's revenue expenditure this past year has been fairly low-key, consisting of replacement or redecoration of litter bins and liners, weed-killing, mowing, strimming and hedge-cutting etc. as well as updating computer software needed to aid website management. The number of businesses advertising in this booklet has increased this year raising enough to cover the cost of printing.

Grants have been awarded by the Council to Sedlescombe Churchyard Fund (£300), to Battle Community Transport (£100), Rural Rother Trust (£50), and E.Sussex Association for the Blind (£25).

Another bank account has been opened with Barclays Bank for depositing funds for the proposed pavilion. This now includes deposits from the Parish Council, the Sports Association, from grants and various local fund-raising events. Up-to-date details will be available at the Annual Assembly. An account with the Bank of Scotland now holds the Clerk's Gratuity Fund. The funds being held in the Village Security Fund have been absorbed into General Funds. The Tennis Courts Fund has been maintained and ends the year with £5,000 towards future expenses. The two major capital projects have been:

- Construction of a pedestrian footway outside the Queen's Head (£3,319)
- Purchase and fitting out of a second-hand portacabin to replace the old and vandalised timber pavilion at the sportsfield (£3,245)

2008-9 Financial Year. After three years of holding the precept at £28,270, the Parish Council will this year receive £29,000 from the Sedlescombe Council Tax. This modest rise will help meet increased costs of maintaining Village amenities and will include a budget for additional Councillor and Clerk training.

The main capital expenditure for the Council in 2008-9 is expected to be for work on the new sports pavilion.

KNOW YOUR PARISH COUNCILLORS



CLLR VALERIE WRIGHT, 01424 870220. Chairwoman of Sedlescombe Parish Council. Valerie Wright joined the Council in 1995, becoming Chairwoman in 1999. Valerie is ex-officio member of every Council committee and represents the Council at many meetings of outside bodies. In the past year, Valerie has been actively involved with looking for funding for the new sports pavilion. This year, she has

been a founder member of the Friendship Club.



CLLR ANTHONY RAND, 01424 870722 Vice-Chairman Anthony Rand joined the Council in 1995 and is currently its Vice-Chairman. He is an ex-officio member of every Council committee and represents the Council on youth matters. He has been involved with several Council projects, most recently with the purchase and fitting out of a portacabin for use by the local sports clubs and with negotiations for a new

pavilion. Outside Council work, Anthony is on the Parochial Church Council and is Chairman of the Friends of the Parish Church, helping to raise funds for the preservation of the building.



CLLR PAT MARTIN, 01424 870353, Chairman of Planning Committee and Emergency Working Group. Pat Martin has lived in

Sedlescombe since 1968 and has been on the Parish Council since 1983. As a professional tree surgeon, his expertise is invaluable to the Council and Pat has been the Sedlescombe Tree Warden for many years. During this year, he has been working on various tree projects with the Primary School.

As well as being Chairman of the Planning Committee and of the Emergency Working Group, Pat sits on the Council's Finance Committee.



CLLR RALPH DELLOW, 01424 870223, Chairman of the Crime & Safety Advisory Committee, the Environment Working Group and the Footpaths Working Group. Ralph Dellow joined the Council in 2000 since when he has been actively involved with crime and safety issues. As well as being Chairman of a Committee and two Working Groups, Ralph sits on the Finance Committee. This year, he has raised funds for the

proposed new sports pavilion and has done a lot of work on public footpaths. Ralph represents the Council on the Neighbourhood Watch Group. Outside Council work, in the past year, he has been a founder member of the Friendship Club and has been involved with environmental work at the Pestalozzi International Village. He is a Trustee of the Village Hall and a member of the Sedlescombe Societies Association.



CLLR PAULINE GLEW, 01424 870258, Chairman of Finance

Committee. Pauline Glew first became a parish councillor in 2003. She is the Council's Village Hall Trustee and is involved in raising money for the hall. As well as being Chairman of the Finance Committee, she sits on the Crime & Safety Advisory Committee. Pauline oversees the working of the

Sedlescombe Lift Scheme and has organised two Speed Indicator Device Initiatives in the Village. She is one of the Council's representatives on the Rother Association of Local Councils. Outside Council life, Pauline is a member of Sedlescombe Neighbourhood Watch and works at Batemans at Burwash. During the year, she has helped with the Friendship Club, especially the Extend Exercise Class.



CLLR BILL CAMERON, 01424 870013. Bill Cameron has been a parish councillor since 2001. He serves on the Planning Committee where his expertise is invaluable and is a member of the Emergency Team. Outside Parish Council work, Bill is on the Parochial Church Council. He also belongs to the Friends of the Pestalozzi Estate, Friends of the Ashdown Forest and Friends of Bedgebury National Pinetum.



CLLR MARY IRWIN, 01424 870570. A retired schoolteacher, Mary Irwin joined the Council in 1990. She is a member of the Finance Committee and of its Crime & Safety Advisory Committee. Outside Council life, Mary is a member of Sedlescombe WI and has, for many years, worked for infant welfare in the Village, as well as being a Village Hall Trustee and Primary School Governor.



CLLR CAITLIN WHEATLEY, 01424 870162. Caitlin Wheatley is the newest councillor, joining in May 2007. She is on the Parish Council's Planning Committee and the Crime & Safety Advisory Committee and is one of the Council's representatives on the Rother Association of Local Councils. Outside Council work, Caitlin has two small children and is the

Chairman of Jelly Beans, a parent and toddler group run by Mums. She is Trustee of the Village Hall.



CLLR JENNY MITCHELL, 01424 870707. After a short break, Jenny Mitchell was co-opted back on to the Council in November 2007. Outside Council work, Jenny is Treasurer of Sedlescombe Green WI and Secretary of Sedlescombe Sports Association. Jenny's husband David started the Rangers Junior Football Club and Jenny helped him run the

SEDLSCOMBE PARISH COUNCIL'S ANNUAL REPORT TO THE PARISH 2008 ASSEMBLY



May 2007 marked the start of a new four-year term for councillors with the Council remaining focussed on the Parish Plan's main aim

"To make Sedlescombe a vibrant place that values its past but looks to the future and where people are proud to live and work and be part of a caring community".

All that the Parish Council does is covered by the subsidiary aims of making the community informed and participating, healthy and safe, of helping provide Village amenities and services, of supporting business and rural employment and of protecting and enhancing Sedlescombe's built and natural environment. In order to keep residents informed, Parish Council meetings have remained open to the public and now, after adopting the 2007 Councillors' Code of Conduct, Standing Orders have been amended to allow the public to speak at the discretion of the Chairman at any Council Meeting on any agenda item.

Information for residents is provided mainly through the Parish Council Website (www.sedlescombe.org.uk) but also through the Noticeboard outside the shop, weekly Parish News, Rye & Battle Observer and Quarterly Bulletins delivered to each home. Welcome information Packs are delivered to people moving into the Village.

Each year, the **Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting** of Sedlescombe is the main opportunity for the Council to bring together the community to hear what the Parish, District and County Councils have been doing and for residents to raise matters of concern or interest. Over the last three years, averages of a hundred people have attended and have raised a wide range of topics. Display tables by Village Organisations and businesses, including last year the local shop serving sausages and French bread, give everyone the opportunity to encourage new members or customers.

For the second year running, the Parish Council sent out a **questionnaire** in the autumn this time asking residents to list three concerns about life in Sedlescombe. Only a small number of residents were concerned enough to send back their completed forms but **roads and footways** came out top of the list followed by **anti-social behaviour** and **parking**.

Although the Parish Council has no responsibility for any of these matters, throughout the year it has acted as an intermediary between residents and the authorities who do have appropriate powers but not always the necessary funding. The Council knows that the speed of vehicles is of particular concern to many residents and it was pleased therefore to hear that, following a campaign by local residents, the County Council had offered to provide two permanent **vehicle-activated 30mph signs** in The Street.

Last summer, in response to a request from the Parish Council, a new pedestrian **footway** was installed outside the Queen's Head which should improve the safety of pedestrians walking in that area. Most of the funding was provided by the Parish Council. Local funding is, currently, the only way of obtaining these safety improvements but most are out of the range of the Parish Council.

Inconsiderate **parking** has been a problem throughout the year whether outside the School and Doctors in Brede Lane and Park Shaw or blocking the entrance to Pumphouse Yard in The Green. Nuisance parking on grass verges or the edges of the Village Green has caused a lot of damage to the grass during the winter.

Keeping the community safe from **criminal or anti-social behaviour** is the job of the Police. For its part, the Parish Council has remained involved by keeping in touch with the local Police and the Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) and by allowing representatives of agencies such as Orbit Housing Association and the Youth Development Service to attend its Crime and Safety Committee Meetings. It is expected that the Council will work closely in 2008 with the local Police in a new Neighbourhood Policing Initiative.

After a prolonged episode of nuisance being created day and night at the Kickabout Area, which badly disturbed nearby residents, the Parish Council reluctantly agreed that Orbit could take down the youth shelter. Throughout the year, the Youth Development Service has been working with a group of young people and had hoped that, using grant aid obtained by the youngsters, the Scout Hut could be turned into a small community centre and a venue for a supervised youth club. East View householders were individually canvassed about the plans resulting in a majority in favour. Further delays were created by the unfortunate and devastating fire at the Hut in November 2007.

Vandalism continues to afflict us and there is no doubt that, with all Council Tax payers contributing towards repairs, these acts are anti-social. In the summer, repairs to the substantial damage caused to the roundabout at the Riverside Playground resulted in additional expense on the Council Tax. The Council is grateful to The Bridge Garage for their repairs on two occasions to the entrance gates to the playground. Despite all, the Council remains convinced that the majority of young people who use the playgrounds do so responsibly and, therefore, continues to make improvements where it can. A new recycled plastic seat and large litter bin have been installed at the Riverside Playground paid for out of the last part of the Sedlescombe Riverside Playground Regeneration Group's Landfill Tax Credit Grant.

Anti-social behaviour does not just involve young people but can be anything that adversely affects the lives of other people. This year the Parish Council has been consulted on Rother District Council's **Dog Control Orders**. The Parish Council has not been convinced that under existing arrangements enforcement is ever likely to take place in the rural areas and has written to the Chief Constable asking that PCSOs are empowered to take action against owners who fail to abide by the Orders. The Removal of Dog Faeces Order will put extra pressure on the small number of dog bins we have in the Village. Dog owners are asked to consider taking dog waste home with them for disposal in their own refuse bins or providing a dog loo in your own garden in order to avoid adding additional plastic bags to landfill?

One of the subjects brought up at the last Assembly was the construction of a replacement **pavilion** at the sportsfield. At that time, the idea of the Parish Council taking out a loan to pay for the building was attractive because of the urgency of finding improved facilities for the Football Club. However, because of the additional long-term cost to the Sedlescombe Council Tax, it was subsequently decided that the Council would continue the work already started by the Sports Association and would try to obtain a substantial grant from the Football Foundation. This has entailed the Parish Council in many hours of work during the year but, eventually, this came to nought as the Football Foundation were only willing to fund a pavilion of a size specified by them. This size would have been too big for current local needs and expensive to run in the future. So once again, time has been wasted and the Council is now working on the plans that were approved in 2006. Sedlescombe is fortunate in having several people who are willing and able to participate in fund-raising and they have formed into

a group to oversee a programme of interesting fund-raising events during the year. The installation of the portacabin at the sportsfield by the Parish Council has meant that, for the time being, the Football Club can continue to play at the field.

The Parish Council has been negotiating with the owner to purchase the land on which the **bus shelter** in The Street stands. In addition, a condition of the planning approval for the Park View development to the rear of Kester House and Tanyard Cottages also requires improvement to the bus stops on both sides of The Street. Hopefully, this will mean that a new bus shelter of a design approved by the Parish Council will be provided by the developer. Unfortunately, the reduction in the local bus service has caused some disruption to the lives of local residents but, unfortunately, it appears that there is no funding to ensure that the hourly service is returned.

Sedlescombe is very fortunate in having several volunteers who have carried out a programme of removal of stiles and replacement with gates on several public **footpaths** around the Village. The sale by Southern Water of most of its land around the Powdermill Reservoir resulted, following a national appeal, in the Woodland Trust buying Brede High Wood and the remainder of the land being brought by the Hurst Estate. Since the purchase, the Hurst Estate has followed the Parish Council's lead and carried out work replacing old broken stiles with kissing gates to allow walkers and their dogs easy access to the footpaths network. New waymarks are being also installed for walkers' guidance. Dog walkers are being asked to keep their dogs on leads whilst walking the public footpaths on the Hurst Estate.

Valuing the past, is not always something associated with the young so the Council was particularly interested to receive an approach from a local young person who wishes to stage an **exhibition** in Sedlescombe of the watercolours of a local 19th century artist. Further details will follow in due course.

The **pump** on the Village Green once provided an important water supply in the Village centre. However, for the last fifty years it has been purely ornamental. The Council would like to hear from local people their views on whether they would support refurbishment of the pump. It would be good if grant aid could be obtained but, if not, should the Council Tax be used for this purpose? The cost is expected to be around £5,000. Let the Council know at the Assembly.

The Parish Council has been able to support local organisations this year. As well as working on raising funds for a new pavilion, the Council is hoping to be able to help the newly-formed Sedlescombe **Netball Club** by allowing it to use the **tennis courts** for practising. Again, decisions about the courts' future will need to be made in the next couple of years. If you have any suggestions, please get in touch.

Councillor and Clerk **training** is very important nowadays and a Training Strategy has been adopted by the Parish Council. Courses have been attended and some in-house training provided. Sedlescombe parish councillors have attended two Rother planning seminars in order to play a full part in the Government's new-style planning system.

The Parish Council's Planning Committee has met to consider and comment on every **planning** application in the Parish. The major applications were Pestalozzi's three planning applications, a barn conversion to a dwelling on a farm in Brede Lane, an office building at Marley Lane Business Park and dwellings at Park View, Cartref and RN French in The Street.

The introduction of new **waste collection** arrangements by Rother was not as smooth as was hoped and has involved the Parish Council in forwarding complaints to Rother. As well as problems with domestic collections, Rother's new arrangements for emptying litter bins and street sweeping have been very unsatisfactory. The Parish Council are carrying out regular monitoring and lobbied Rother until the situation improved.

The Council has acknowledged the new **environmental duties** imposed on parish councils this year by adopting a new Biodiversity Strategy for Sedlescombe. Councillors have been in discussion with Churchwardens regarding the introduction of environmentally-friendly maintenance of the churchyard so that the green-winged orchids and glow-worms are conserved. Residents of Gorselands will be reminded of the Council's wish to see the wildflower verges on their Estate preserved including the autumn lady's tresses orchids which grow quite vigorously there. The Tree Officer has been working with the School to plant trees in the grounds and a large number of bulbs have been planted there.

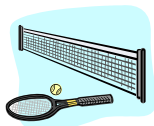

- ✓ Built and maintains the Parish Council website. New site March 2008.
- ✓ Receives, via the local Council Tax, about 85p/week from a Band D Council Taxpayer to meet the cost of the services it provides.
- ✓ Is the sole trustee and manager of the Sedlescombe Playing Field Trust (tennis courts/playground area at the Riverside).
- ✓ Owns and maintains the East View Kickabout Area.
- ✓ Owns and maintains the Red Barn Field Nature Park.
- ✓ Is the registered owner of the Village Green and is responsible for its maintenance.
- ✓ Owns the freehold of the sportsfield and has leased the land to the Sedlescombe Sports Association for 30 years from 2005.
- ✓ Cuts the grass at the Brede Lane Car Park on behalf of Rother District Council.
- ✓ Owns and maintains litter bins and seats.
- ✓ Employs a contractor to collect litter in the playgrounds.
- ✓ Serves hedge-cutting letters, maintains road guide posts and carries out rights of way maintenance for East Sussex County Council.
- ✓ Has published "Footpath Walks Around Sedlescombe", "A Walk through History in Sedlescombe", A Parish Plan, A Parish Map, "A Century of Village Life in Sedlescombe", A Local History DVD, A "Waste Not" leaflet, a Sedlescombe Emergency Plan, a Wildlife Gardening leaflet.
