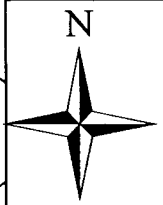

NOTICE OF MAKING OF AN ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

EAST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

**THE EAST SUSSEX (SEDLSCOMBE 2c [PART]) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION
ORDER 2007**

The above Order, made on 17 October 2007 under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will divert that part of public footpath Sedlescombe 2c which runs from a point on the southern boundary of Little Brede Wood at TQ79571843 and runs in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 25 metres to TQ79617842, then in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 150 metres to its junction with Brede Lane at TQ79711853 as shown on the Order plan. The new line of the path shall be a route having a width of 2.5 metres running in a north-north-easterly direction from the above mentioned point on the southern boundary of Little Brede Wood at TQ79571843 for a distance of approximately 175 metres to terminate at Brede Lane at TQ79671857.

A copy of the Order and Order Map and an explanatory statement have been deposited and can be inspected free of charge in the Main Reception area at the County Council's Offices at County Hall, St Anne's Crescent, Lewes on Mondays to Fridays between 9.00am and 4.00pm and at the Offices of Rother District Council at The Help and Advice Centre, 6 Market Square, Battle. Copies of the Order may also be purchased from the County Council (price £1.00).

Any representations about or objections to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Law at the Legal Services Department, PO Box 2714, County Hall, Lewes, East Sussex BN7 1AL no later than 3 December 2007. Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the East Sussex County Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.
