SEDLESCOMBE

No crimes have been recorded for this period.

EWHURST GREEN

STAPLECROSS & CRIPPS CORNER

25th January - Report of a theft of a tax disc from a tractor.

25th January - Report of an attempted burglary in a non-dwelling – the investigation is ongoing.

29th January - Report of fly tipping in the Broad Oak area - this is currently under investigation.

BODIAM

No crimes have been recorded during this period.

Recent Good Results for the area:

- A local male was found guilty of Criminal Damage to a Police Vehicle, causing £200 worth of damage. He was Committed to prison for 8 days because the offence was aggravated by committing it whilst subject to a 12 month prison sentence.
- A local male was recently found guilty of GBH. Despite pleading ' Not Guilty' the courts found him guilty, and awarded him with a 28 week prison sentence, suspended for 2 years.

LOCAL PRIORITIES - SEDLESCOMBE

These were the priorities set at the last Panel Meeting:

Priority 1

What you said: Speeding through the village.

What we did: Regular speed checks conducted as early as 0600 hours. An NPT officer assists regularly.

What happened: Tickets were issued which results in a fine and points on the licence.

Priority 2

What you said: Anti social behaviour.

What we did: Regular patrols have been made around the village and East View Terrace. The partnership formed with Orbit Housing is working well and regular reports have been given for problematic individuals.

What happened : Letters of warning sent out by housing regarding tenancies. ASBO officer alerted regarding trouble makers.

Priority 3

What you said: Parking around the school.

What we did: Had a meeting with school head and discussed possibility of walking bus.

What happened: Landlady of pub allows parents to use pub car park in the mornings. Letters sent out to parents regarding walking bus. Had further meeting with Head of school and walking bus will begin next month.

LOCAL PRIORITIES - EWHURST GREEN

Priority 1

What you said: Speeding through the village.

What we did: Regular speed checks conducted including early mornings with a Neighbourhood Policing Team officer.

What happened: Tickets issued to offenders.

Priority 2

What you said : Parking around the school.

What we did: Had a meeting with the head.

What happened: Letters have been sent out to the parents regarding polite and considerate parking.

OPERATION DANEGATE

Police have been carrying out a special operation on the Rother District involving extra high visibility patrols in the evenings/nights. This has been a great success in reducing crime whilst offering a visible presence police to the community.

OPERATION VORTEX

Operation Vortex has come to the Rother District. This is a high visibility operation which will be located at different areas of the district. It involves carrying checks on vehicles being driven in Rother for offences such as no insurance, no MOT, condition of vehicle etc.
